Yellow-legged Gull (*Larus michahellis*)

Conservation status in Spain: Near Threatened

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Found near the coast

Audouin's Gull (*Ichthyaetus audouinii*)

Conservation status in Spain: Vulnerable

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Found near the coast



European Shag (*Gulosus aristotelis*)

Conservation status in Spain: Vulnerable

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Found flying near the coast or on islets

Balearic Shearwater (*Puffinus mauretanicus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Critically Endangered

Status in Mallorca: From November to June

In Sa Dragonera: May be seen, at a distance, from the lighthouses



Scopoli's Shearwater (*Calonectris diomedea*)

Conservation status in Spain: Endangered

Status in Mallorca: From March to September

In Sa Dragonera: May be seen, at a distance, from the lighthouses

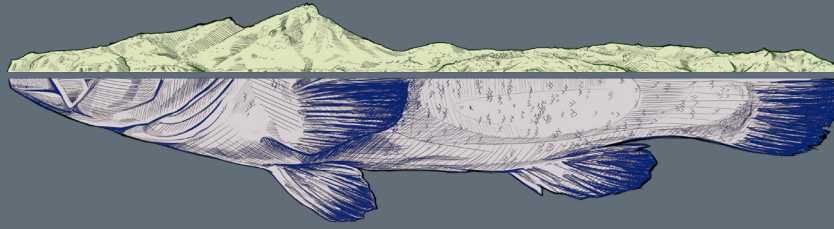
Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Endangered

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: One or two individuals may be seen along the coast

Booted Eagle (*Hieraetus pennatus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: One or two individuals may be seen overflying the island

Common Kestrel (*Falco tinnunculus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Endangered

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: One or two individuals may be seen overflying the island



Eleonora's Falcon (*Falco eleonora*)

Conservation status in Spain: Near Threatened

Status in Mallorca: From May to October

In Sa Dragonera: Seen easily all over the island, particularly along the cliffs

Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Near Threatened

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: One or two individuals may be seen overflying the island



Wood Pigeon (*Columba palumbus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident, abundant

In Sa Dragonera: Found all over the island, particularly in wooded areas

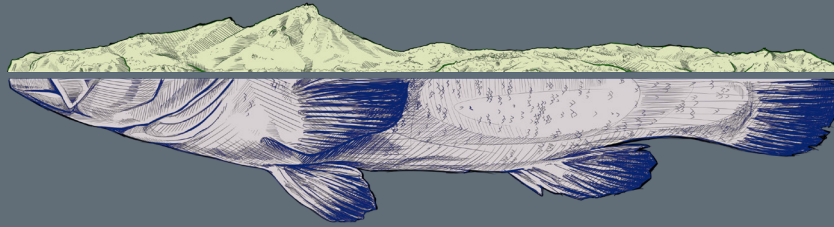
Turtle Dove (*Streptopelia turtur*)

Conservation status in Spain: Vulnerable

Status in Mallorca: From May to October

In Sa Dragonera: Difficult to find, mainly in wooded areas

Eurasian Hoopoe (*Upupa epops*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Mainly found in orchards and on open ground

Eurasian Wryneck (*Jynx torquilla*)

Conservation status in Spain: Vulnerable

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Difficult to find, in orchards and woods



Eurasian Blue Tit (*Cyanistes caeruleus*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Mainly in wooded areas

Great Tit (*Parus major*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Mainly in wooded areas and orchards



Eurasian Crag Martin (*Ptyonoprogne rupestris*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Mainly overflying cliffs and hills

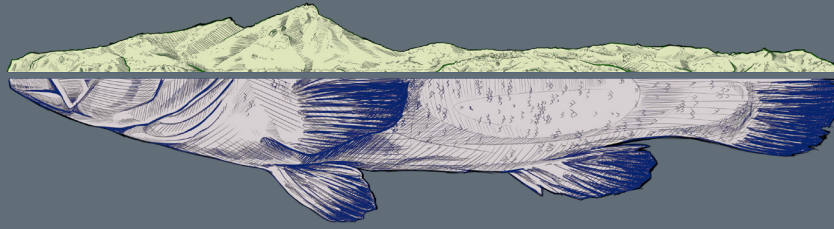
Common Chiffchaff (*Phylloscopus collybita*)

Conservation status in Spain: Near Threatened

Status in Mallorca: From October to May

In Sa Dragonera: Found all over the island, mainly orchards, low bushes and shrubs

Eurasian Blackcap (*Sylvia atricapilla*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Found all over the island, mainly orchards and scrubland

Balearic Warbler (*Curruca balearica*)

Conservation status in Spain: Not Evaluated

Status in Mallorca: Resident, endemic

In Sa Dragonera: Found in coastal scrubland



Sardinian Warbler (*Curruca melanocephala*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Easily found all over the island, mainly in shrubs and bushes

Common Firecrest (*Regulus ignicapilla*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Mainly found in wooded areas



Common Blackbird (*Turdus merula*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Mainly found in open areas and orchards

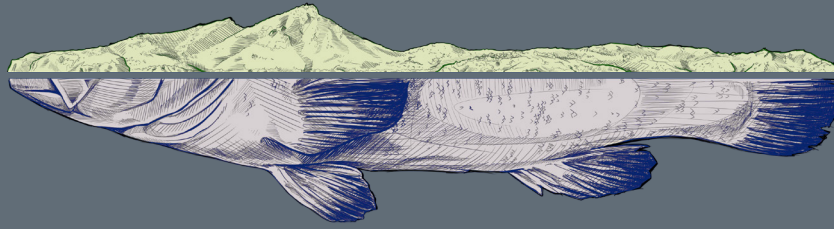
Song Thrush (*Turdus philomelos*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: From October to April

In Sa Dragonera: Easily found in orchards and open woodland

Mediterranean Flycatcher (*Muscicapa thyrrhenica*)

Conservation status in Spain: Not Evaluated

Status in Mallorca: From May to September

In Sa Dragonera: Easily seen in orchards, olive groves and scrubland

European Robin (*Erithacus rubecula*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: From October to April

In Sa Dragonera: Found all over the island



Common Nightingale (*Luscinia megarhynchos*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: From April to October

In Sa Dragonera: Mostly in scrubland, difficult to see but calls often

Black Redstart (*Phoenicurus ochruros*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: From October to April

In Sa Dragonera: Easily seen in open fields and orchards



Blue Rock Thrush (*Monticola solitarius*)

Conservation status in Spain: Least Concern

Status in Mallorca: Resident

In Sa Dragonera: Found on cliffs and rocky ridges

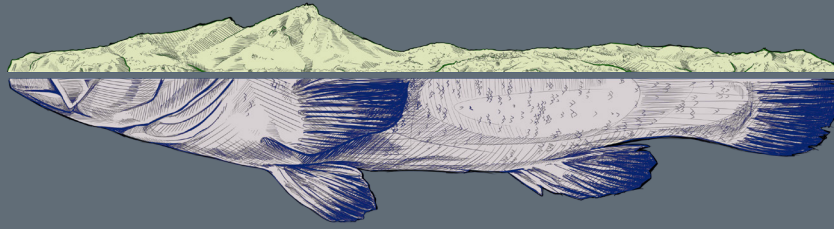
European Stonechat (*Saxicola rubicola*)
